

# Electrical Fire?

## Here's What to Do

Smart steps to fight flames—when it's safe



### Prioritize People Over Property

Evacuate First. Always

- If flames are large, GET OUT
- Ensure everyone's safe
- Then assess if you can fight the fire



### Kill the Power

Avoid Shock: Shut Off Electricity

- Use circuit breaker, not power strip
- Don't touch outlets if fire is near
- This stops live current hazards




### Use the Right Extinguisher

Only Use Class C Extinguishers

- CO2 (black label) or Dry Powder (blue label)
- Water or foam = electrocution risk
- Look for rating: "Safe for electrical fires"

### Fight From a Distance

Keep Exit Behind You



### Don't Reignite Trouble

If Flames Return, Back Out

Re-sparking = hidden fire



Heat, thick smoke = danger sign

Evacuate + call 911

### When to Use Baking Soda

For Very Small Fires Only



### Hidden Fire Risks

What You Can't See Can Still Burn

Wall fires? DO NOT punch holes

What Most People Get Wrong



Is water safe?

No! Unless power's off



Can I use an ABC extinguisher?

Yes, but it may damage electronics



What size is okay to fight?

Smaller than a wastebasket
